

American Bible Society Innovation Grant Request for Proposal (RFP)

American Bible Society (ABS) is excited to announce a research grant opportunity for Christian higher education scholars from various academic disciplines. This grant aims to build upon the themes presented in the <u>State of the Bible: USA</u> reports by exploring and testing interventions that promote increased Bible engagement and foster positive changes in spiritual vitality and well-being. Special emphasis will be placed on solutions that address the Bible engagement needs of individuals in the "Movable Middle."

A total of \$75,000 in grant funding is available. Applicants may submit proposals requesting \$5,000 to \$15,000 for research and reporting over a one-year period.

ABS is especially interested in Scripture Engagement programs that impact people who are between ages 18 – 35. Proposals should aim to:

- 1. Increase the frequency and duration of meaningful interactions with the Bible among next-generation adults.
- 2. Guide participants to consider how Scripture applies to their daily lives.
- 3. Encourage individuals who are merely curious about the Bible to begin consistently engaging with it.
- 4. Be contextualized for participants from different Christian traditions (e.g., Catholic, Protestant, Orthodox, etc.).
- 5. Include an evaluation component that tracks changes in Scripture engagement, along with other quantitative and/or qualitative measures. For this research agenda, change will be measured using ABS's **Scripture Engagement Scale**.
- 6. Demonstrate scalability and potential for replication in diverse settings and among various groups.
- 7. Include a final report that will be shared with the American Bible Society's community of scholars and may be published in an academic journal.

Grant Timeline:

- Research grant applications will be reviewed starting **19 January 2026** and will continue until all grants are awarded.
- Initial awards will be announced by 1 March 2026.
- IRB approval from the sponsoring institution must be obtained before funds are committed.
- Funds will be distributed following selection and completion of a formal grant agreement to the principal investigator's college or university.
- Work on the grant must be completed on or before June 1, 2027. No funding will be provided for research extending beyond the grant period.

Eligibility Criteria

Grants are available to university or college faculty members with a proven record of research in spiritual formation or discipleship, specifically with next-generation adults. Grants may be awarded to individuals or research teams with an identified principal investigator.



Proposal Requirements:

Proposals should include the following components:

- 1. **Program Narrative**: A general overview of the proposed program, including the <u>issue</u> or <u>need</u> being addressed, a description of the study <u>design</u>, and the expected <u>impact</u> on participants. The program should be informed by relevant literature and provide theoretical support for its rationale. (Maximum 500 words).
- 2. **Detailed Plan of Action**: A <u>timeline</u> outlining major milestones and steps to complete the project. This detailed plan will be submitted once the proposal is accepted and before funding is provided.
- 3. **Budget**: A one-page summary of the program's proposed budget, including anticipated programmatic and personnel expenses and the requested grant amount.
- 4. **Communication Plan**: A description of how the project results will be shared with relevant stakeholders, including academic journals, Christian higher education, and the Church broadly.
- 5. Curriculum Vitae: A CV for each team member, compiled into one concise document.

Intellectual Property Rights:

Intellectual property resulting from the funded programs will be owned by the research team. American Bible Society will receive non-exclusive perpetual rights to use the results in creating its own materials without limitation.

Proposal Submission Instructions:

Please submit your proposal by email as a single PDF, including the following items in the order listed:

- Cover letter
- Proposal narrative (not to exceed 500 words)
- Budget
- Communication plan
- Curriculum vitae for each team member
- Letters of support (optional)
